Beginning on Easter Sunday, we return to communion closer to our pre-COVID practices. This means the return of wafers and cups of wine and juice. It will also mean a readjustment to our worship life. As we get used to these practices again, there is space for grace! We will continue to refrain from intinction or common cup options.

What if it's hard for me to walk up to receive Communion?

Please let the ushers know and someone will bring the elements to you.

What if I'd like to continue taking the communion packets (pre-sealed elements)?

We will continue to have pre-sealed elements in the trays alongside cups of wine and grape juice. You can come forward and are welcome to receive in whichever way you prefer.

Can I help serve communion? Yes! We are looking for communion servers to help distribute the elements and always seeking others to help our altar guild (Deanna Posig) in preparing the elements. Speak with Pastor Matt if you are interested in either of these ways to serve!






Let's Help Adoration Stand With Ukraine!

Lutheran Disaster Response: *Lutheran Disaster Response is accompanying our companion churches in Ukraine, Hungary, Poland and Slovakia, as well as such ecumenical partners, in their humanitarian responses to the crisis.*

These partners provide refugees with immediate support and supplies such as food, blankets, water and hygiene kits. Gifts to "Eastern Europe Crisis Response" will be used in full (100%) to assist those affected by the crisis in Ukraine and neighboring countries.

How is Lutheran World Relief helping?

We are committing \$4 million to respond to this crisis and are on the ground working with partners in and around Ukraine to rapidly develop programming plans based on short- and long-term needs.

As part of this response, **we are providing emergency funds to Ukrainian refugee families in Poland.** Cash will be distributed at Lutheran churches throughout southwest Poland.

Your congregation's gift will deliver urgent support and care, like: food, shelter and other critically needed items; Mission Quilts and Kits for families who fled their homes; and medicine and supplies for clinics. This is a great opportunity for families, church groups, employee volunteering days, or individuals!



Information from ERAS: New Programs for Seniors in Our Community!

Stand Up & Move More (Milwaukee County)

This workshop is designed to help adults reduce sitting time by standing up and moving more. Sessions take place in a group setting where participants identify barriers to standing more and discuss strategies to increase their standing time. Based on a researched and tested program, Stand Up is shown to: reduce sedentary behavior by 68 minutes per day, reduce problems performing daily activities, reduce pain interference and intensity, improve functional performance, improve vitality and improve general overall health. The program meets once a week for four weeks, followed by a Booster Session at Week 8.


