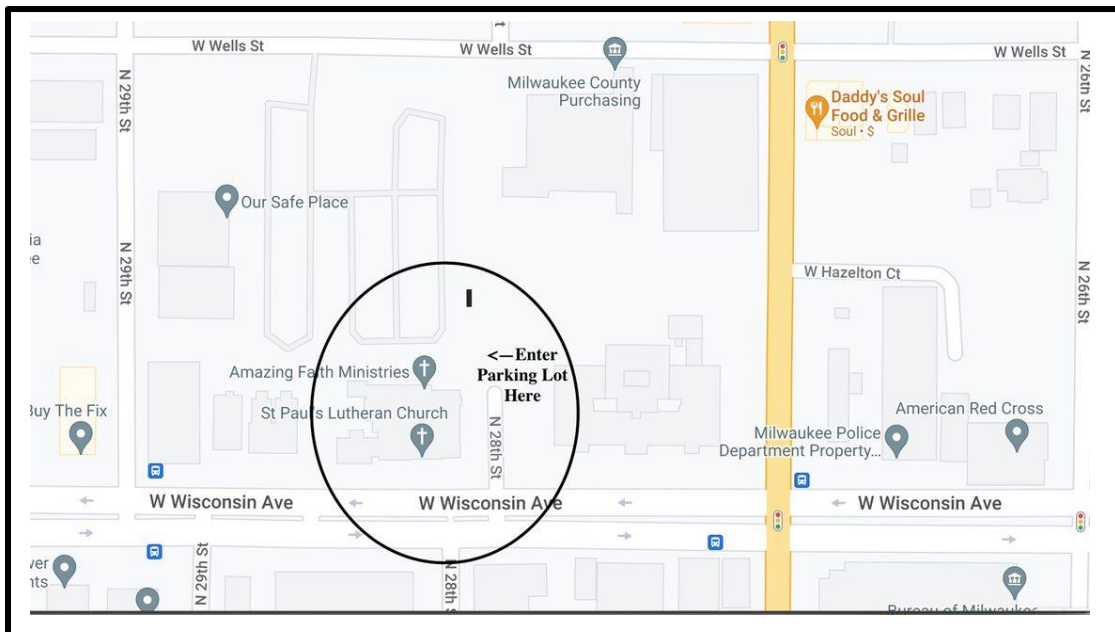
In celebration of Reformation Sunday and the baptism of Milo Schlake-Kruse, Adoration is invited to worship together at St. Paul's Lutheran Church.

***There will be Wednesday evening worship at Adoration on Wednesday, November 2nd.**





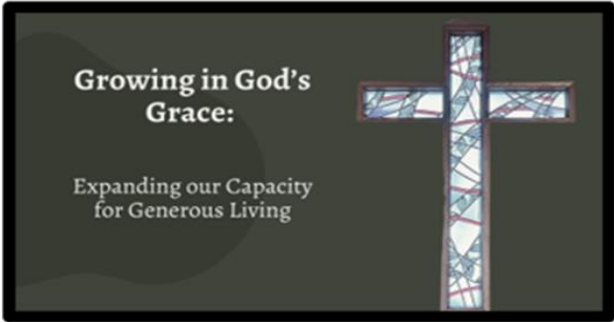
This Fall's Stewardship Focus is...

"Growing in God's Grace: *Expanding our capacity for generous living.* Initial letters were sent via mail this week; Pledge Cards will be distributed on Sunday, October 23rd. The Sunday Bulletin will contain some prompts to get thinking about how we might expand our generosity throughout our lives!

God's Story

Genesis 1:27-31a (CEV).

"So, God created humans in God's own image; God made men and women. God gave them a blessing and said: Have a lot of children! Fill the earth with people and bring it under your control. Rule over the fish in the ocean, the birds in the sky, and every animal on the earth. I have provided all kinds of fruit and grain for you to eat. And I have given the green plants as food for everything else that breathes. These will be food for animals, both wild and tame, and for birds. God looked at all that was created. All of it was very good!"



Our Generosity Stories: Questions to Think About

- How does our household talk about money? What words do we use?
- Who decides how we distribute our money, especially related to regular giving?
- How much of our spending is influenced by advertising?
- What churches, institutions of faith, organizations or other causes do we support? Why do we choose them?
- **Why do we share? Why do I Give?**

Reflecting on Generosity:

How do we respond to the One who gives us our very life – the One from whom we receive our identity? *We Christians have a story – a story of God's generosity in and through Jesus.* If we as Christians do not know or pass on God's Story or see God in our story, then Scripture loses its capacity to affect our daily living. ***Our culture's message for us to consume. God's invitation for us to share.*** As followers of Jesus, we ask, is the good life the same as the abundant life? Is happiness the same as joy?

At its foundation, being a consumer is an issue of identity. We need to ask, have modern logos and emblems become the current "cross" or marker that defines us? With more than 3,000 messages a day urging us to spend, how do we lift up the messages inviting us to be generous?

Jeremy Meyers, associate professor of religion at Augsburg College, asserts, "We bought into the consumer culture as sort of the normal practice, and we started to think of church as a product and people as consumers. But what people are yearning for is the ability to connect what their faith community believes with their daily life."

Affirmation + Blessing: I am created in the image of a generous God. I give because I want to mirror a generous God.

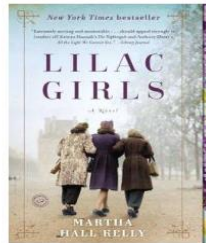
