There will be coffee and time to celebrate with one another the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ.

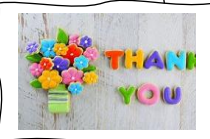

Update on "Old Sanctuary and Fellowship Hall"

For the past few weeks, the older church building, including the fellowship hall, has been dealing with moisture issues and water damage. Our property team, along with many others, have been working to diagnose, control, and remedy these issues. However, with the recent weather and continued freeze/thaw cycles, the water damage and moisture continue to be a problem. Some of the usual places we meet and gather, especially the fellowship hall, will be inaccessible for our Holy Week and Easter services.

As our leaders work to remedy the situation, we ask that folks please avoid accessing the Fellowship Hall, Sunday School and Youth Rooms, and storage areas until further notice. With extra moisture and damp flooring, we want to make sure you remain safe. The congregation is working to get a professional analysis of the source and needs to resolve these water damage issues. We'll have a receptacle for your "piggy banks!"

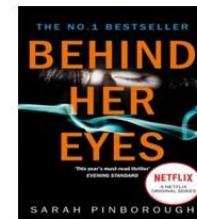

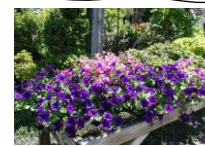
Healing Wholeness Deliverance
